

## EIE2025 session formats

Format	Description	Focus	Total length
<b>Ride the Knowledge Wave (oral presentation)</b>	<p style="color: #008080;"><b>In a Ride the Knowledge Wave session, event attendees learn about and discuss latest implementation research findings.</b></p> <p>Here you can submit an abstract to present your work in a <b>single oral presentation</b>. If your abstract is accepted, you will present in a Ride the Knowledge Wave session with two other presenters (three presenters in total). Each session follows the same format: The oral presentations last <b>12 minutes (9 mins + 3 mins fact-focused Q&amp;A)</b> each; after all presentations, further 20 minutes can be used for discussion.</p> <p>When submitting your abstract, you can indicate if your oral presentation, if not accepted as such, can be considered for a P<sup>3</sup> session (see below).</p>	Presentation of latest implementation research findings	12 mins per single presentation; 60 mins per session
<b>Walk the Talk (symposia)</b>	<p style="color: #008080;"><b>Walk the Talk sessions allow for shared presentations, debate, idea development, and problem solving.</b></p> <p>We differ between four different types of Walk the Talk sessions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• combining <b>three oral presentations</b> under a joint topic; this more traditional form also involves identifying a session chair and a discussant.</li> <li>• creating a <b>topic-specific debate</b> between a panel and the audience; this requires describing clear strategies to engage the audience for approximately half of the session time</li> <li>• preparing a structured <b>idea development (idea jam)</b> session involving the audience throughout</li> <li>• planning for a focused and deliberate <b>problem-solving</b> session, also involving the audience throughout</li> </ul> <p>In the abstract submission portal you will be asked to indicate which of the above types of session your submission represents.</p>	Interactive, and/or co-creative reflection on a distinct implementation topic	60 min
<b>The Open Implementation Fishbowl (debate)</b>	<p style="color: #008080;"><b>An open Implementation Fishbowl session is for lively and open debate of hot topics in implementation.</b></p> <p>Several chairs (traditionally 5) are arranged in an inner circle - the fishbowl. Remaining chairs are arranged in concentric circles outside the fishbowl. A few participants are pre-selected to fill the fishbowl (submitters), while the rest of the group sit on chairs outside the fishbowl. One chair in the fishbowl is left empty.</p>	Lively, edgy discussions & debates of hot topics in implementation (supported through interactive meeting technology)	60 min

	<p>The moderator introduces the topic, and the participants in the fishbowl (inner circle) start discussing the topic. The audience outside the fishbowl listens in. Any member of the audience can, at any time, occupy the empty chair and join the fishbowl. When this happens, an existing member of the fishbowl must voluntarily leave the fishbowl and free a chair. The discussion continues with participants frequently entering and leaving the fishbowl. Depending on how large the audience is, many audience members can spend some time in the fishbowl and take part in the discussion. When time runs out, the fishbowl is closed, and the moderator summarizes the discussion.</p>		
<p><b>P<sup>3</sup> – Promise, Progress, Problems (poster)</b></p>	<p><b>In a P<sup>3</sup> session, event attendees learn about promising implementation work that may be in progress or already has generated interesting findings.</b></p> <p>Accepted presenters will present a poster based on a <b>4-minute lightning talk</b>. Presenters will be grouped (4-5 oral presenters per group) by topic and assigned a moderator; delegates participate in a 10–15-minute Q&amp;A following all presentations.</p>	<p>Lightning talk poster presentation</p>	<p>30-60 min</p>
<p><b>The EIE2025 Implementation Slam</b></p>	<p><b>The EIE2025 Implementation Slam is for those with a passion for creative, entertaining implementation knowledge dissemination.</b></p> <p>An implementation slam presentation lasts <b>four minutes and builds on the use of creative, artistic elements</b> that are uncommon in our standard science presentations. The goal is to spread implementation knowledge in easily relatable ways and win over the audience – because they will vote on all presentations. The science slammer who receives the most applause wins the science slam!</p>	<p>Creative, artistic, entertaining presentation of implementation knowledge</p>	<p>30 min</p>
<p><b>Early Career Implementation Professional (ECIP) keynote</b></p>	<p><b>The ECIP keynote provides early career implementation professionals with an opportunity to present their work in front of a large audience.</b></p> <p>Event participants who identify as ECIP are invited to enter the ECIP keynote competition. You can submit an abstract through the submission portal for the ECIP keynote. Your submission will first undergo the normal, blinded review process.</p> <p>If accepted, submissions will be vetted by an ECIP keynote committee (consisting of 1 EIC board member, 1 program committee member, 1 UK-IS/ UCKL representative, and 1 member of the ECIP planning committee) with candidates having the opportunity to present for this group prior to the final selection of the ECIP keynote.</p>	<p>Early career plenary presentation of hot topic in Implementation</p>	<p>30 min</p>
